

IMPORTANT NOTICE

In the spirit of fairness for both **current and new members** and also to reduce the load on our volunteer registration staff, changes to the registration process have been made. These changes will also be explained at the Program Preview session.

- Registration forms will **NOT** be accepted prior to the distribution of the brochure.
- Registrations received after the brochure is distributed will be numbered and placed in the order received but **will not be processed** until after the Program Preview.

As well changes have been made to the registration process at the Program Preview:

- You will be given a **numbered registration form** as you enter the Program Preview.
- After** the presentations are over, you will then fill out and take your completed registration form to an Ambassador who will do a quick check to make sure everything is filled out correctly.
- Only then** will you proceed to the payment table where your registration and payment will be accepted.
- After the Program Preview**, the office will combine (in numerical order) those registrations received at the Program Preview with those received prior - thus assuring a **fair and equitable** opportunity for both current and new members.

--**Finally**, to allow time for our volunteer registrars to process forms, you will be notified **within 2-3 weeks** whether you have been registered in your chosen course.



Moderators/Facilitators Workshop

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Road construction is still ongoing on Western Road. We appreciate the patience and understanding of our members. Making sure you allow lots of time to get to meetings and courses at Grosvenor Lodge is very helpful. We will try to keep you updated with any disruptions.

In the most recent President's letter it was noted that construction is scheduled to be completed this year, but traffic delays will continue until completion.

With the exception of two recent short-notice closures, the Western Road entrance has remained open. Grosvenor Lodge staff is doing an excellent job communicating with the contractor, ensuring that the entrance remains accessible. In the event that the entrance is blocked again by construction members will notified in advance by e-mail.

Our parking areas can be accessed from Platts Lane by entering the Western residence parking area (going North, on your right just before bend at Western and Wharncliffe, just past Trott Drive on your left). Turn right in the parking area, go to the very end, take the short track and turn left to bring you in front of the Coach House.
